Lac la Belle Fire Department Report

It is wintertime again and time to check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. If you do not have both we highly recommend that you install them.

Please remember to clean your chimneys for those who burn wood and for others who have the new propane furnaces, be sure your exhaust and intake pipes remain clear of snow and ice this winter.



The fish boil for 2023 was a great success so thank you to all who supported our fund raiser and thank



you to our community members who volunteer their time to assist us with this great event! We received \$2302.61 in cash donations and had \$4785 in ticket sales. After expenses we profited \$5163.63! There were over \$1100 in donations of items to put the event on made by businesses not included in the cash totals above. We continue to receive other cash donations after the event as well.

Again, thank you to all who supported us! We are very grateful to each of you!

Other exciting news, we have 4 new members who joined our department this summer! We had 2 join last year. Additionally, we had a former member rejoin and he will be helping when in the area. That brings us to 6 new people in 2 years. Keep in mind some people are here for summers only or here part time. We are always looking for new members.

We took delivery of our new Brush Truck on December 14, 2023. It is a 2022 Ford F550 Crew cab with an enclosed back area that houses a 400 gallon poly tank – 21 HP Honda with a Darley 400 gpm pump – Hose reel and ample storage. It also has a front bumper turret controlled from the cab and the truck has pump and roll capability. There are other features as well. We will be doing something this summer to let the community see this new addition. The old brush truck is being converted into a Rescue unit. More information to come on this in the future.



In 2023 we applied for and received a grant for turnout gear from the State of Michigan. We were awarded \$10,000. This helped to replace 3 sets of turn out gear along with some lights, helmets and gloves. In 2023 we also applied for a grant from Portage Health Foundation (Copper Shores now) – and received a grant for \$5000 to help outfit our rescue unit. This is a matching grant, so we have to spend the matching amount from our funds. In addition, we applied for a grant from the Michigan DNR and received a grant for \$4999. This is also a matching grant, so we will need to spend that amount from our funds. This money was put toward our New Brush Truck Foam system.

So, in total we received \$19,999 in grants for 2023!

Keweenaw County Road Commission



The road commission finished up with the paving projects in the Bete Gris and Gay Lac La Belle Road areas this summer. We are not due for any projects in 2024 in our area. The funds will be spent in Allouez Township this year along with some other small projects in other areas.

The Road Commission took delivery of a new sander truck and decided to purchase the 3 graders that were being leased as this will be a more cost-effective measure for this year. All of them are still under warranty. We will be looking at other options in 2024.

2023/2024 winter so far is mostly a nonevent so we are saving funds and wear on equipment.

Stump dump status

I'm optimistic that we can begin this in 2024 (I would really like to!) and plan to budget for it. The 2.8-acre portion of our land that was the old landfill site needs to be clearly marked and preferably gated off if we find that we're unable to get the restrictive covenants lifted. The remaining adjacent 10 acres shouldn't have any restrictions, but I would like EGLE to confirm that nothing has changed since 1990. The dump site would require a township attendant, much like we do at our Dumpster Days events.

TNC land - The Heartlands

I support having as much local representation as possible. The 'Districts for Board members correspond to districts for County Commissioners' seems reasonable to me. I understand the view that Grant Township residents and taxpayers may want more proportionate representation on the proposed Government Relations Advisory Committee. I don't have strong feelings towards one model or the other so long as our township's representation is knowledgeable and effective.

Proliferation of camps into rentals (AirBnB, VRBO, etc.)

This challenge has been culminating for some time and contributes significantly to our housing challenges. I plan to introduce a local township ordinance for short term rentals in 2024 for the township board to consider for adoption as one piece of a greater plan to improve the housing options within our township.








Ned Huwatschek and Mark Oviatt woke up one morning in late June to discover a crowd in their front yards that
